- All you need to know about the methodological insights when conducting palliative care research involving complex populations.
- The world needs to know about your research: Using social media to disseminate your work.

The **Palliative Care Research Network (PCRN)** will also host an interactive pre-Colloquium breakfast workshop on 'Communicating research to a lay audience' on Thursday 26 October 2017. At this workshop, Sasha Petrova from The Conversation will provide insights on how you could communicate your research to the general public in a language that is understandable to those who don't work in the medical field.
